Mr. James Campbell, LOSSAN Operations Officer, opened the March 6, 2025, LOSSAN Agency TAC meeting and welcomed the TAC members to San Luis Obispo Council of Governments, Large Conference Room.

5. Service Restoration Update

Mr. James Campbell (LOSSAN) provided a verbal update on reopening of stations, the restoration of the 11th roundtrip later in the month, and the goal of restoring the 12th and 13th roundtrips later in the calendar year.

Questions ensued regarding the challenges with restoring the 12th roundtrip and the effective date planned for it. There was no further discussion.

6. Pacific Surfliner Marketing Update

Mr. Chris Orlando (LOSSAN) provided a presentation on marketing updates for the first and second quarters of fiscal year 2024-25. The presentation provided an update on performance, social media metrics, signage, overall performance on bookings, and ads

There was no further discussion.

7. Update of Coastal Resilience Efforts

Mr. James Campbell (LOSSAN) introduced this item before turning it over to the presenters. The presentation on the efforts along the northern corridor was given by Mr. David Berryman (LOSSAN), Ms. Keri Robinson, (SANDAG) and Ms. Anna Devers (SANDAG) provided a presentation on the efforts in San Diego County, and Ms. Megan Taylor (OCTA) provided a brief update on efforts in Orange County. The presentations included high-priority locations with problem areas, planning efforts, strategies and solutions, and ongoing engagements through a variety of working groups.

Questions ensued regarding the problem areas and schedules. There was no further discussion.

8. Upcoming Draft Board Agenda Ítems

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided a brief overview of the agenda items for the March 17, 2025, LOSSAN Agency Board of Directors' meeting.

9. Los Angeles – San Diego – San Luis Obispo Rail Corridor Agency Update

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided an update was given on the current ridership that shows 54 percent increase for ridership between February 2024 and February 2025. There will also be an upcoming work window with future track closures in South Orange County and a small closure near Solana Beach over the weekend.

There was no further discussion.

10. Technical Advisory Committee Members' Report

SLOCOG mentioned the buy-down ticket reduction program with LOSSAN for a 75% discount.

SBCAG mentioned recent events regarding mental health awareness and the support LOSSAN provided in the event, and an upcoming meeting with the new Board member.

RCTC mentioned they continue to coordinate with FRA / Caltrans on the Corridor ID Program with Coachella Valley Rail and in partnering with LOSSAN on the project.

OCTA mentioned there will be no Metrolink Angels Express this year and that there will be expanded Metrolink service for the upcoming Women's March over the weekend.

NCTD mentioned the service updates for the upcoming baseball season.

HSR mentioned an upcoming Los Angeles to Anaheim Project draft environmental document coming in late June.


Corridor Identification and Development Program

The CID Program is a federal program intended to:

- Develop a sustained, comprehensive intercity passenger rail planning and development program
- Set forth a capital project pipeline ready for Federal funding

The CID Program and Service Development Planning:

- Service Development Plans (SDPs) establish the service concept and necessary capital projects to operate service
- SDPs will identify phased infrastructure investments to accomplish service goals identified in the Rail Plan






Coachella Valley Rail Project Update




Coachella Valley Rail Proposed Service
