3. Capital Projects and Programming Update James D. Campbell

Staff will provide an update on the progress of ongoing capital projects along the Los Angeles - San Diego - San Luis Obispo rail corridor, and their associated funding, including the Central Coast Layover Facility, Union Pacific Santa Barbara Subdivision projects, Goleta Layover Facility Expansion, and San Diego County Layover and Maintenance Facility.



4. Continuance of Rail 2 Rail Agreements with the Southern California Regional Rail Authority and North County Transit District James D. Campbell

The Rail 2 Rail Program provided significant benefits to passengers traveling on the Los Angeles - San Diego - San Luis Obispo rail corridor by increasing the number of train operations for travel along the corridor, particularly now that service by all agencies has been reduced in response to the policies and restrictions that have been implemented to address the COVID-19 pandemic. The agreements to provide the Rail 2 Rail Program between the Pacific Surfliner and Metrolink and COASTER services on the Los Angeles - San Diego - San Luis Obispo rail corridor expire June 30, 2020 and July 31, 2020, respectively. Staff will provide an update on the efforts to prepare an amendment to the existing agreements to continue the program.

5. Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program Update

James D. Campbell

The Los Angeles - San Diego - San Luis Obispo Rail Corridor Agency worked with member and partner agencies to submit an application requesting nearly \$80 million as part of the 2020 Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program. Grant applications were due on January 16, 2020, and the California State Transportation Agency announced project awards on April 21, 2020. Staff will provide an update on the Los Angeles – San Diego - San Luis Obispo Rail Corridor Agency projects that were awarded funding.

The Los Angeles – San Diego – San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) Rail Corridor Agency (Agency) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) met on March 5, 2020, at 12:30 p.m. at the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Henry Huntington Room, 3rd Floor.

Welcome and Introductions

The March 5, 2020, LOSSAN Agency TAC meeting was called to order by Mr. James Campbell, LOSSAN Program Manager, who welcomed the LOSSAN TAC to the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority, One Gateway Plaza, California. Mr. Campbell asked the participants in the room and over the teleconference line for introductions.

1. Public Comments

There were no Public Comments.

2. Approval of Minutes

The Committee approved the February 2020 meeting minutes.

REGULAR CALENDAR

There were no Regular Calendar matters.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

3. Capital Program Funding

Mr. James Campbell (LOSSAN) provided a summary on the evolving Capital Program of projects that the LOSSAN Agency is leading, which included updates to on-going infrastructure projects and facility expansions, where the funding is coming from to proceed with the design and construction of several of these projects and which projects still require funding in order to move forward.

Mr. Jay Fuhrman, LA Metro, asked about the fiscal years that State Rail Assistance funding currently covers. Mr. Campbell confirmed its for fiscal years 2018, 2019 and 2020. A brief discussion ensued regarding the funding for projects and the process for moving individual projects forward. There was no further discussion.

4. Agreement for Design and Construction and Interim San Luis Obispo Layover Facility

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided information on the need to store one additional trainset in San Luis Obispo to support implementing an additional roundtrip. Mr. Campbell stated that Union Pacific would be designing and constructing the expansion of the facility with Amtrak providing the design review. Staff are planning to take an amendment to the Board of Directors (Board) to authorize the managing director to execute the required preliminary engineering (PE) agreement with Union Pacific to design this project and other the individual capital improvements necessary for two additional round trips north of Los Angeles.

A brief discussion ensued regarding the construction for the interim facility. There was no further discussion.

5. Capital Project Update

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided a detailed overview and update on the San Diego County Layover and Maintenance Facility study, the Goleta Layover Facility Expansion and the Central Coast Layover Facility Expansion projects. For the San Diego County Layover and Maintenance Facility study, preliminary recommendations were presented to the study Project Development Team on possible site locations earlier in the week. Consultant will incorporate the comments received and prepare a final report on the study.

For the Goleta Layover Facility Expansion, Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) that Amtrak has selected a designer for the project and is currently working with the LOSSAN Agency and Union Pacific to access the proposed property to perform initial surveys and begin the design process.

The Central Coast Layover Facility Expansion project is currently on hold while staff work with Union Pacific and get their input into the draft site selection study and recommendation. A design charrette with the local stakeholders will then be scheduled once Union Pacific input has been received.

A brief discussion ensued regarding more information on planned facility expansions. There were no further discussions.

6. Upcoming Agenda Items

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided an overview of the agenda items for the March 16, 2020 Board of Directors' meeting.

A brief discussion ensued for clarifying questions.

7. Los Angeles – San Diego – San Luis Obispo Rail Corridor Agency Update

Mr. Campbell (LOSSAN) provided a brief update on the Grover Beach station that is adding an additional parking and a new bus facility.

In addition, a position has posted for a State and Federal Programs Manager.

Also, there are no significant changes on the Surfliner for April, but a mid-cycle change in July is being planned. There will also be a third roundtrip to San Luis Obispo, possibly by the October schedule change.

8. Technical Advisory Committee Member's Report

Mr. Danny Veeh, SANDAG, mentioned the San Diego river bridge is now open and both tracks are now in service. Mr. Veeh also mentioned California Passenger Rail Summit that will take place April 21-22, near Petco park.

Ms. Megan LeMaster, OCTA, mentioned Angels Express will begin in April, with a special Metrolink service to and from Anaheim Stadium at ARTIC. Also, adding a weekday evening roundtrip, from Oceanside to LA.

Mr. Fuhrman, LA Metro mentioned additional services from Ventura, from April to October, as well as cutting service, from LA to Burbank trains, which estimated three people per train.

Mr. Vaughn, SCRRA mentioned additional midday service was planned to start in April on the 91- Perris Valley Line.

Mr. Romana, High-Speed Rail Authority, gave an update on environmental process for the Palmdale-Burbank and mentioned open houses scheduled for the following week for the Burbank-Los Angeles.

LOSSAN Capital Program

The Los Angeles - San Diego – San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) Rail Corridor Agency (Agency) has evolved over past seven years into an implementation agency.

- Coordinate, fund, and lead projects along the LOSSAN rail corridor
- Capital Program includes large capital projects, but also many small amenity and passenger focused projects.

- Goleta Layover Facility Expansion
 - Design work order executed through Amtrak
 - Coordinating Preliminary Engineering (PE) Agreement with Union Pacific
 - Scheduling initial meeting with Amtrak and Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) to discuss concepts
 - Project will design and construct expansion allowing one additional trainset to layover

- Central Coast Layover Facility
 - Underway with PAED phase
 - Coordinating PE Agreement with Union Pacific and soliciting their input on site selection study
 - Possible virtual design charrette with stakeholders at the end of May or early June.



- San Diego County Maintenance and Layover Facility
 - Completing site selection study
 - Received 2020 Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) funding
 - Will be coordinating with stakeholders to define next steps.
